TWO MORE REPORTS ON EXHIBITION

Two additional reports are now out on exhibition for public comment.

CES Supplementary Report January 2008

This report presents an alternative access to the Option 3 breakwater proposal, namely a road on the beach with a rock wall revetment between the roadway and the sea.

Ancillary Structures Report

This report provides superficial information on lighting, toilets, and boat-washing and fish-cleaning facilities.

What to say in your submission

Submissions must focus on the new material only, and not on the original EES. If you wrote an earlier submission, you need to quote your submission number. It is important to write submissions in your own words with your own points of view.

Your submission could be as simple as saying: "I wish to reiterate my strong opposition to the breakwater development access roads and ancillary structures as proposed by EGSC - Refer to submission no...."

Or you can include the following points:

CES Supplementary Report (Jan 2008)

This road access is completely unacceptable, and is the same as a proposal that was knocked back in 1991.

Key points to make:

- This road alienates a greater area of beach from public access and usage.
- It is visually imposing and destroys the scenic values and integrity of the Wilderness Coast.
- There is potential for increased maintenance costs through storm and sea damage.
- It fails to address traffic management issues.

Ancillary Structures Report

This report fails to provide sufficient detail on design, costs, location and impact assessments on key components of the proposed development.

Key points to make:

- We support the exclusion of boat washing, boat rigging area and fuelling facilities from Bastion Point.
- Fish cleaning facilities and lighting should also be excluded.
- Plans for toilet facilities need to consider all users, and be appropriately designed and located.
- It is unacceptable to rely on seabirds to eat fish scraps.
- Location of cleaning station is still not specified.
- Lighting on breakwater is visually intrusive, and night boating should never be considered because of extreme hazards and risks to safety.
- Chemical toilets located near the Pittosporum walk are not appropriate (issues include proposed location, distance from car-park, variable visitation numbers, unspecified size, vegetation removal, and construction and maintenance costs).

LEGAL TEAM

We are pleased to inform campaign supporters that the Environment Defenders Office (EDO) has secured the services of two barristers to act with EDO as part of our legal team during the Inquiry. Sarah Porritt and Emily Porter will have the crucial role of cross-examining all Council's and SBPC's expert witnesses. It is important to note that this type of support for our campaign is *essential* for going into an Inquiry in order for us to have a real crack at winning this.

EXPERT WITNESSES

EDO is now working closely with our expert witnesses who have proven credentials in a relevant topic to the proposed development. Experts are required to submit to the Panel a statement of evidence on their subject of expertise. They will be expected to answer questions from the Panel and the barristers acting for SBPC and Council. The views of the experts we have secured will support our arguments. Experts are a *crucial* part of arguing a case at an Inquiry.
